Trials are concurrent from 9am-2pm.

Run your dog with small break between runs if entered twice, and you can leave after your runs. The Run Order is based on the order of entries received. No preference shall be granted for dogs to run early. CABT runs will start after the last Fast CAT run of the day.

Dogs must have an AKC Registration number and be at least one year of age on the day of the trial. Dogs may only run once per test. One dog per entry form. All entries must be accompanied with a check or online payment to be valid. A returned check is not a valid entry. FastCat events are open to all dogs at least 12 months of age that are individually registered with the AKC registration, dogs granted a Purebred Alternative Listing (PAL) number, dogs with AKC Limited or Conditional Registration or dogs enrolled in the AKC Canine Partners program, Dog with breed disqualifications and monorchid/cryptorchid dogs are eligible to participate.

CABT (Coursing Ability Test) Basics

COURSE DESIGN:

The course shall be designed with safety for all breeds as a primary consideration. There shall be no turns more acute than 90 degrees. The total length of the course shall be no less than 600 yards and should be as close to 600 yards as possible. The lure will consist of plastic strips. Dogs run singularly in Coursing Ability Tests. Depending on the size and breed of dog, the dog will run either the full course or a 300-yard course. The 300-yard distance shall be clearly marked. Safety is of utmost importance. The judge is responsible for walking the course prior to the start of the event in order to look for hazards.

DISTANCE AND MAXIMUM TIME:

300-Yard Course – This distance is for dogs shorter than 12 inches at the withers and/or brachycephalic (“flat-faced”) dogs. A veteran dog may run 200 yards at the owner’s discretion. A dog must complete this course in less than 1 ½ minutes. 600-Yard Course – This distance is used for all dogs that do not run the 300-yard course. A veteran dog may run 400 yards at the owner’s discretion. A dog must complete this course in less than 2 minutes. If there is a question whether a dog should run the 300- or 600-yard course, the judge will decide.

COLLAR/PARAPHERNALIA:

Dogs may wear any collar except a choker collar, a collar with prongs, or an electronic training collar. The collar should be snug to minimize the chances of getting hung on something during the run. Owners may use clips or rubber bands to hold the dog’s hair. The owner assumes responsibility for the safety of the dog with regard to the dog’s collar and paraphernalia. Harnesses or head halters may be used on the grounds but must not be worn while running the course.

Titles:

Coursing Ability (CA) – Awarded to a dog that passes the Coursing Ability Test three times under at least two different judges.

Coursing Ability Advanced (CAA) – Dog passes the Coursing Ability Test a total of 10 times.

Coursing Ability Excellent (CAX) – Dog passes the Coursing Ability Test a total of 25 times. A numbered title will be awarded for every additional 25 passes.

What is the Fast CAT?

Coursing is an athletic activity that can tax a dog's physical strength. Dogs that are overweight and/or out of condition may be at greater risk for injury and exhaustion. The inspection committee has the authority to disallow a dog's entry into a test and, in such instances, applicable entry fees will be refunded. At roll call, all dogs will be measured by a wicket to verify handicaps. Bitches in season, lame and unfit dogs will be excused with entry refunded. Please do not bring bitches in season to the test.

Fast CAT is a timed straight 100-yard dash for dogs. Dogs are held at the start line and the coursing lure is activated prompting the dog to follow chasing it to the finish line and into a catch pen. The course is completely fenced, and dogs are run individually. Dogs are timed when they complete the 100-yard dash. The time is converted to Miles Per Hour (MPH).

FORMULA: $204.545 / \text{RUN TIME} = \text{MPH}$

$\text{MPH} \times \text{HANDICAP} = \text{POINTS (ROUNDED TO NEAREST 0.01)}$

Based on the dog's size at the withers a handicap is applied, and points are earned:

- 18" or greater = Handicap is 1.0
- 12" up to less than 18" = Handicap is 1.5.
- Below 12" = Handicap is 2.0.

$\text{MPH} \times \text{HANDICAP} = \text{POINTS}$

Titles are earned at specific point levels and the highest suffix may appear after the dog's name:

BCAT = 150 points DCAT = 500 points FCAT =
1,000 points

FCAT# = Each additional 500 points

EVENT HOURS

Grounds will be available at 8:00 AM. It is the responsibility of each entrant to make an effort to be ready when their assigned group is called to the line. The event will begin promptly at 9:00AM until all runs are completed.

- Fastest 1st-4th in 18" or greater class (1st place will receive \$20 gift card)

Trial Site Directions

From the North: Take I-97 South off the Baltimore Beltway. Exit New Cut Road. Turn right at the end of the ramp. Follow approximately 1.5 mile to fork in road. Bear left onto Gambrills Rd. Go approx 2 miles to flashing red traffic light and turn left onto Dicus Mill Rd. Turn right at the second street, Ski Lane.

After 3 houses, the main road turns left and the driveway to 470 continues straight ahead. Follow the signs to the far back of the property keeping the wire fence to your left at all times. Please note that the drive is now 2 way traffic.

FROM ANNAPOLIS OR BOWIE:

Take either Interstate 97 north or Rte 3 north to Rte 32 west. Exit Burns Crossing Road. At the end of a long ramp; turn right at the traffic light onto Burns Crossing. Take the first immediate street on the right, Dicus Mill. Go approx two miles to stop sign and flashing yellow light, continue straight and follow the directions above to Ski Lane.

FROM THE WEST:

Take Rte 32 east to Burns Crossing Road. Turn right at end of ramp. Right at first traffic light, then left at next light onto Burns Crossing. Turn right onto first immediate street, Dicus Mill and follow directions above.

FROM WASHINGTON, DC:

Take either Interstate 95 or the Baltimore Washington Parkway north to route 32 east, follow above instructions from the west.

FROM SEVERNA PARK:

Take Benfield Blvd west to four way stop sign; turn left onto Najoles Rd. After 1 mile Najoles turns abruptly right and changes names to Dicus Mill Rd. Continue approx 1.5 miles further to a left onto Ski Lane.

Follow directions to site above.
